A Taste of Iowa County: Ackerman Winery

Come wine with us as Cassie Bott from Ackerman winery shares the history of Ackerman and Fireside wineries, complete with wine tasting. "What to do when you suspect dyslexia?"

Mindy VanZuiden will return to the library for the second of a 2-part series about dyslexia. In Mindy's first program, she debunked multiple myths and misperceptions about this learning disorder. "What to do when you suspect dyslexia?" will focus on seeking diagnosis and resources for loved ones suspected of having dyslexia, a specific learning disability that is neurobiological in origin. Dyslexia is characterized by difficulties with accurate and/or fluent word recognition and by poor spelling and decoding abilities. Mindy is a board member of Decoding Dyslexia Iowa, a private dyslexia tutor, and a Project Teacher with the Mid-Prairie Homeschool Assistance Program. Mindy holds a master's degree in Education Leadership and is a Certified Dyslexia Specialist through the University of Florida. Tues., Nov. 16 at 7 p.m.


the kids and join us for a special Storytime by the fireplace on Fri., Nov. 19, at 5 p.m.
